Adenophora (Commonly known as 'Lady Bells')

Lady Bells enjoy well drained, moist, rich soils in partial shade environments. They will spread slowly (through runners) and freely so give them plenty of room to grow in your garden. Lady Bells are a close relative of the Campanula and are commonly mistaken for them. Growing on average between 2 and 3 feet Lady Bells feature leafy-green branching stems in the late spring that give way to trumpet like, bell-shaped, pale blue flowers in the summertime. After the blooming season a hardy haircut refreshes the Adenophora and flushes new growth wonderfully.
