Heucherella (Commonly known as 'Foamy Bells')

Heucherella is a fairly new genus created by crossing a Heuchera with a Tiarella. Heucherellas are great border plants and are excellent near pathways offering vibrant foliage color all season long and panicle style blooms in the late spring. In garden beds they pair well with Ferns, Hostas, Astible, Dicentra and other shade loving perennials. Heucherellas enjoy rich, well draining soil but will not tolerate wet feet or heavy soils that drain poorly. Heucherellas are wonderful plants in containers, providing both the services of a spiller and filler while not overwhelming other varieties.

Why We Love It

- Heucherella is a domestic hybrid (intergeneric) – a hybrid between different genera

While hybrids between species is common, hybrids using different genera usually cannot be interbreed – making the Heucherella unique

- Created artificially in 1912 by Emile Lemoine
- Botanical name combines both parents genus names

Heuchera + Tiarella = Heucherella

- Common name combines both parents common names

Coral Bells + Foamflower = Foamy Bells
